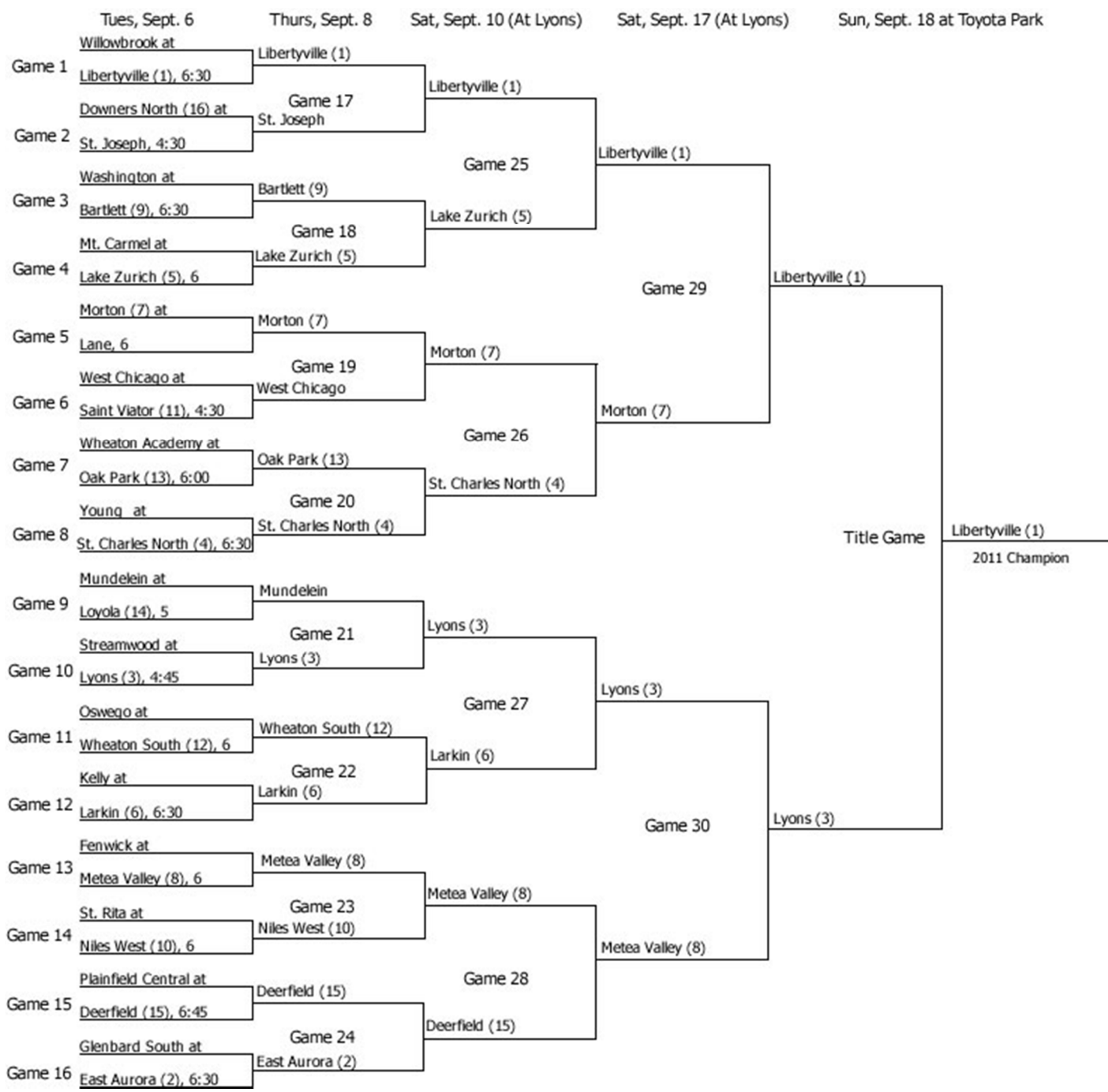


2011 Tournament



TUESDAY SEPT. 6 RESULTS

St. Joseph 5, Downers North 0: Ruben Estrada had a hat trick for St. Joseph (4-2), increasing his season total to seven goals and carrying his team to Thursday's Sweet 16. Jose Carrera (goal, three assists), Isaac Sutton (goal) and Israel Tovar (assist) also starred in the win, while Dontae Gillespie recorded the shutout. The Mustangs, which lost three players before the start of the season to the Fire Academy, fell to 0-6-1.
